Maths

Measurement –Mass, capacity and temperature– children will compare and measure capacity, volume and mass. Children will be introduced to different units of measurement including grams and kilograms.

Measurement and number – Money – the children will begin to count money in pence and pounds separately before counting them together. Finally, children will complete calculations using their knowledge of money.

Number – Fractions – children will look at parts and wholes before progressing to look at halves and quarters of objects and quantities. Finally, children, will count in fractions up to a whole.

Measurement – Time – children are introduced to the concepts of o'clock and half past the hour. Children will learn about how many hours are in a day and how many minutes are in an hour.

Measurement - Statistics – children are introduced to and shown how to interpret block diagrams, tally charts and tables.
